



1234 Parents!



Thoughts on Stewardship

"For where your treasure is, there your heart will be also." - Matthew 6:2 Treasure. What a word. As a noun, it speaks of riches, usually stored up. It may speak of any precious items that are valuable to you. As a verb, it speaks of collecting or storing up things of value. It means holding on to those things that you love the most. In other words, we treasure our treasures. In asking where is our treasure, we answer the question where is our heart. And maybe even who or what we are serving. For me, one of the main points in this Gospel passage is my relationship with Jesus. Am I seeking a real, vibrant relationship with God? It is not too difficult to think of examples of men and women who have laid up for themselves treasures upon the earth, thus showing where their heart truly is.
