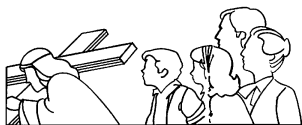

Charitable Gift Annuities give you additional income: If you are over 65 and have \$10,000 or more to invest, possibly from a CD that is coming due, you may want a Charitable Gift Annuity which will give you higher rates than a CD, will give you a large tax deduction and provide you with quarterly fixed payments for the rest of your life. Here are some sample rates based on your age: Age 65-4.7%; Age 70-5.1%; Age 75-5.8%; Age 80-6.8%; Age 85-7.8%; Age 90 and older-9%. At your death the remainder of the Gift Annuity can go to the parish endowment fund and other charities. Praying Pacem in Terris

Hence, before a society can be considered well-ordered, creative, and consonant with human dignity, it must be based on truth. St. Paul expressed this as follows: "Putting away lying, speak ye the truth every man with his neighbor, for we are members one of another." And so will it be, if each man acknowledges sincerely his own rights and his own duties toward others. Human society, as We here picture it, demands that men be guided by justice, respect the rights of others and do their duty. It demands, too, that they be animated by such love as will make them feel the needs of others as their own, and induce them to share their goods with others, and to strive in the world to make all men alike heirs to the noblest of intellectual and spiritual values. Nor is this enough; for human society thrives on freedom, namely, on the use of means which are consistent with the dignity of its individual members, who being endowed with reason, assume responsibility for their own actions. Haitian Corner

**«Hosanna Au Plus Haut Des Cieux! »
 Frères et Soeurs Bonsoir!**

Le dimanche des Rameaux est célébré le dernier dimanche avant Pâques. Cette fête commémore l'entrée triomphale de Jésus à Jérusalem et la Passion du Christ. Elle marque le début de la Semaine sainte. Selon les Evangiles, Jésus est entré dans Jérusalem sur un âne. Il a été acclamé par une foule nombreuse qui l'accueillait en déposant des vêtements sur son chemin et en agitant des branches ou des palmes.

C'est en mémoire de cette entrée triomphale à Jérusalem que les fidèles portent des rameaux (de buis, d'oliviers, de lauriers ou palmiers...). Ces rameaux, une fois bénis, sont tenus en main par les fidèles qui se mettent en marche, en procession : marche vers Pâques du peuple de Dieu à la suite du Christ. On procède au cours de la célébration à la lecture de la Passion du Seigneur, le récit de l'ensemble des souffrances du Christ depuis son arrestation au jardin des oliviers jusqu'à sa mise au tombeau. Cette Passion est le mystère de la Pâque du Christ allant vers la mort et offrant sa vie par amour pour le salut de l'humanité. C'est dans la Passion du Christ, indissociable de la Résurrection que le chrétien, par le baptême, fait lui aussi le passage de la mort à la vie.
