Now the order which prevails in human society is wholly incorporeal in nature. Its foundation is truth, and it must be brought into effect by justice. But such an order—universal, absolute and immutable in its principles—finds its source in the true, personal and transcendent God. He is the first truth, the sovereign good, and as such the deepest source from which human society, if it is to be properly constituted, creative, and worthy of man's dignity, draws its genuine vitality. (26) This is what St. Thomas means when he says: "Human reason is the standard which measures the degree of goodness of the human will, and as such it derives from the eternal law, which is divine reason... Hence it is clear that the goodness of the human will depends much more on the eternal law than on human reason." (37-38)

Frères et Soeurs Bonsoir! DIVINE MISÉRICORDE!

Le Dimanche de la divine Miséricorde a été institué dans l'Église catholique par **Jean-Paul II** le 30 avril 2000, le jour de la canonisation de sœur Faustine. Dans le calendrier liturgique, il est célébré chaque année le dimanche qui suit le dimanche de Pâques, également appelée octave de Pâques, deuxième dimanche de Pâques, ou dimanche de Saint-Thomas. « Il faut que l'humanité se laisse atteindre et imprégner par l'Esprit que le Christ ressuscité lui donne. C'est l'Esprit qui guérit les blessures du cœur, abat les barrières qui nous éloignent de Dieu et qui nous divisent entre nous, restitue la joie de l'amour du Père et celle de l'unité fraternelle. Dans les diverses lectures, la liturgie semble désigner le chemin de la miséricorde qui, tandis qu'elle reconstruit le rapport de chacun avec Dieu, suscite également parmi les hommes de nouveaux rapports de solidarité fraternelle. Le Christ nous a enseigné que « l'homme non seulement reçoit et expérimente la miséricorde de Dieu, mais aussi qu'il est appelé à "faire miséricorde" aux autres: "Bienheureux les miséricordieux, car ils obtiendront miséricorde" (Mt 5, 7) ». Cette année, c'est encore plus spécial que Divine Miséricorde week-end sera aussi la canonisation de notre bien-aimé Jean Paul II. **Jésus, nous avons confiance en Toi!**

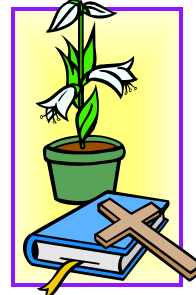
