To establish a Charitable Gift Annuity, you need to be 65 or older and have \$10,000 or more. This is a contract between the individual and The Catholic Foundation of North Georgia. You will receive quarterly payments for the rest of your life. The rate of return is based on your age when you establish the annuity. Here are some sample rates: 65-4.7%; 70-5.1%; 80-6.8%; 85-7.8%; 90 or older 9%. Haitian Corner

Dimanche des familles

Les lectures bibliques de ce dimanche nous adressent un enseignement de la plus haute importance sur la vie familiale et fraternelle. Elles nous donnent l'occasion de nous rappeler de vérités fondamentales qui risquent d'être oubliées dans notre société. L'évangile nous parle de la fidélité dans le mariage et de l'accueil des enfants. Sa lecture est préparée par le récit de la Genèse. Il nous dit que l'homme et la femme forment une union inséparable. La seconde lecture (lettre aux Hébreux) nous rappelle que le Christ est resté fidèle jusqu'à la mort.

Le passage de la Genèse qui nous est proposé aujourd'hui est hautement symbolique. C'est l'un des textes les plus importants de la bible. Les mots que Dieu prononce sont significatifs : "Il n'est pas bon que l'homme soit seul... Je vais lui faire une aide qui lui correspondra." L'homme n'a pas été créé pour vivre seul. S'il était seul, il ne pourrait pas vivre d'amour. Dieu est Amour. S'il a créé l'homme, c'est pour lui communiquer son amour. Il veut le rendre capable de vivre dans l'amour. Il a donc créé l'homme et la femme en même temps. Tous deux sont égaux devant lui.

Le but de ce récit n'est pas de nous dire comment les choses se sont passées. D'ailleurs, en y regardant de plus près, nous voyons qu'il s'inspire de traditions orales qui circulaient dans le Moyen Orient païen. Mais sous l'impulsion de l'Esprit Saint, il nous propose une vision très riche de Dieu, du monde et de l'homme. Le texte d'aujourd'hui nous rapporte le grand projet de Dieu : "L'homme quittera son père et sa mère... il s'attachera à sa femme" non pas avec les liens de la domination ou de la soumission mais avec celui de l'amour.
