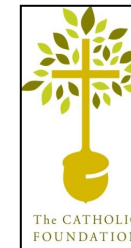
OLM Open House

**Haitian Corner
 Le cadeau de la foi**

Les lectures bibliques de ce dimanche sont un appel à la foi. Même quand tout va mal, le Seigneur est là. Son amour nous est offert une fois pour toutes. C'est ce message d'espérance que le prophète Jérémie adresse à son peuple. Ce dernier vient de vivre une situation catastrophique. Il a connu la déportation en terre étrangère. Cela s'est fait sans ménagement. Nous pouvons imaginer la situation désespérée de tous ces gens vivant loin de leur patrie. Mais voilà que le prophète Jérémie annonce le retour proche et heureux des rescapés. Pour les aider à garder l'espérance, il évoque la joie de ce retour. Ce sera quelque chose d'extraordinaire. Ce sera vraiment un jour de fête et de joie pour tous.

L'Évangile nous parle de la foi qui sauve. C'est l'histoire de Bartimée, l'aveugle assis au bord de la route. Bien qu'il soit aveugle, il reste clairvoyant. Il reconnaît en Jésus le « Fils de David », autrement dit, le Messie. En réponse à son cri de confiance, Jésus lui répond : « Va, ta foi t'a sauvé. Ce qu'il faut bien remarquer c'est que cet homme est sauvé avant même d'y voir. Le salut que Jésus apporte n'est pas la guérison d'une infirmité physique. Être sauvé, c'est être tiré d'un danger dans lequel nous allions périr. Ce péril mortel, nous le découvrons tout au long de la Bible. Dieu se révèle à nous comme celui qui sauve.

C'est ainsi que l'homme sauvé va devenir disciple. Lui qui était mis à l'écart de la société va briser les frontières dans lesquelles il était enfermé. Son cri est un cri de foi et de confiance. Il jette le manteau qui lui servait à recueillir les aumônes. Désormais, il n'en a plus besoin. Il bondit vers Jésus. Fais que nous puissions vivre en toi et trouver en toi le bonheur éternel. Amen
