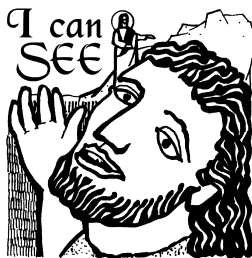

### REFLEXIONS SUR LES LECTURES DU TRENTIÈME DIMANCHE DU TEMPS ORDINAIRE (25 Octobre 2015)

L'Évangile du jour rapporte la guérison de Bartimée. Assis sur le bord du chemin, aveugle de naissance, il entendit le bruit de la foule qui passait et comprit qu'il s'agissait de Jésus. "Jésus, Fils de David" se mit-il à crier de tous ses poumons "Aie pitié de moi." La foule ennuyée lui commande de se taire. On est toujours dérangé par les pauvres, les gens en détresse, les immigrants, les lettres d'Haïti de cousins quémandeurs, les appels des organisations d'aide pour les sans-logis du pays d'origine.

Mais Jésus, lui entendit Bartimée, le pauvre méprisé. Il prêta attention au cri de détresse "Seigneur fais que je voie." VA, LUI DIT-IL, TA FOI T'A SAUVÉ." Jésus nous enseigne ainsi que son message en est un de délivrance. On ne doit pas fuir le pauvre. On doit lui apporter soulagement et guérison.

Bartimée dans sa misère avait la foi. Il reconnut Jésus plus vite que ceux qui avaient des yeux sans voir. La première lecture raconte également une histoire de délivrance. Jérémie annonce le retour des hébreux exilés à Babylone. "Dieu dit-il est un père pour Israël. Il les ramène par des chemins surs vers "des rivières d'eaux abondantes." Dieu veut toujours nous amener vers les rivières de lumière et de vie, les eaux du batême, de la repentance, de l'Esprit, de la paix et de la joie." Comme Bartimée nous devons avoir la foi et l'humilité d'appeler au secours. Qu'il nous délivre de nos aveuglements cachés et de la dureté du Coeur!

Le chrétien ne se replie pas sur lui-même. Il se penche sur tous les Bartimés qu'il croise sur son chemin! Heureux ceux qui croient en Jésus! Ils luttent pour le triomphe de l'amour et de la vie!
