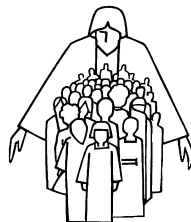

Haitian Corner

Les lectures de ce jour nous annoncent une bonne nouvelle : nous sommes tous appelés à devenir des saints. Certains peuvent se dire : "ce n'est pas pour moi pauvre pêcheur". En fait, la sainteté est bien pour tous car dans le ciel il n'y a pas des saints. Pour nous aider comprendre cet appel, nous prenons le temps de revenir sur les textes bibliques de ce jour.

Nous avons l'Apocalypse de saint Jean. Ce mot « Apocalypse » nous fait penser à une catastrophe. En réalité, il s'agit d'une révélation. Ce livre vient nous révéler le but de la vie chrétienne. Il veut encourager les chrétiens persécutés : « tenez bon, le mal n'aura pas le dernier mot »

Dans la seconde lecture, c'est saint Jean qui nous parle. Il nous dit que chacun de nous est un « enfant bien-aimé de Dieu » ; nous sommes appelés à partager sa gloire.

L'Évangile qui est proclamée en ce jour ne nous parle que de bonheur. Il nous dit : "heureux les pauvres de cœur... Ceux qui pleurent... Ceux qui sont persécutés pour la justice... les cœurs purs... les miséricordieux..." Voilà un message qui va à contresens de ce que pensent la plupart des gens. Notre monde croit que pour être heureux, il faut être riche et en bonne santé plutôt que pauvre et malade. Beaucoup n'hésitent pas à frapper pour posséder toujours plus. Ils pensent que l'accumulation des biens matériels pourra les combler. Mais ce n'est pas vrai.

Le seul qui peut vraiment nous combler c'est Dieu lui-même. Pour aller à lui, il nous faut nous débarrasser de tout ce qui nous encombre, notre orgueil, nos prétentions. Pensons à mère Teresa de Calcutta : elle n'avait rien pour elle-même. Tout était pour Dieu à travers les plus pauvres parmi les pauvres. Ce témoignage et bien d'autres nous rappellent que ce qui fait la valeur d'une vie, c'est l'amour. Si nous donnons à Dieu la priorité dans notre vie, si nous sommes prêts à renoncer à tout ce qui nous détourne de lui, nous trouverons le vrai bonheur ; lui seul pourra nous combler pleinement.
