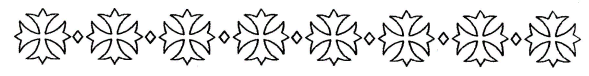

**Tutors Needed for CCA Refugee Clients**  
 Did you spend countless hours asking your parents to explain a homework question when you were a student? Many refugee students have parents who are trying to learn English themselves. Therefore, it is difficult to assist and help with their child's schoolwork. Make a difference in the life of a newly-arrived refugee family by volunteering to tutor students. Taking just two hours out of your week will empower families by supporting children who are adjusting and learning in a new country. Tutors will work with small groups of refugee students (2-3) to help with homework, assist with studying, and practice English. Our academic mentoring sessions will be held at Indian Creek Elementary School in Clarkston, beginning now through the end of the school semester in May. The schedule is Tuesday and Thursday afternoons, 2:30-4:30. Volunteers must attend a mandatory orientation and receive an additional three-hour training on child abuse. All trainings will be held at our Northlake Office (2305 Parklake Drive, Ste. 150, Bldg. 9, Atlanta 30345). The rate of return you receive is based on your age and is set by the American Council on Gift Annuities. If you are 70, you would receive 5.1%; if you are 80, you would receive 6.8%.
